The One-Year Program

THE ONE-YEAR PROGRAM IS DESIGNED to enrich the work of those interested in understanding and working with individuals, families or groups, improving personal relationships, and enhancing their quality of life. Students are introduced to modern psychoanalytic theories and techniques in order to develop a deeper understanding of human dynamics. This introduction is enhanced through experiential learning, using real life examples and cases as a lively way to enrich the classroom experience.

TWO CONSECUTIVE CLASSES MEET one evening every other week for 10 weeks per semester. Each class is 90 minutes. BGSP faculty members teach all courses.

SEMESTER ONE

An introduction to the basic theories and techniques of psychoanalysis including regression, transference, resistance, and the psychosexual stages.

The Maturation Process

- How the mind develops and the sense of self evolves
- Understanding key developmental stages and conflicts

Transference and Resistance

- Understanding the function of resistance
- Using observations for making inferences and interventions
- Recognizing transference and its implications

SEMESTER TWO

An exploration of techniques for gaining access to the unconscious, using symbolic communication and induced feelings, as well as other steps in the psychoanalytic process.

Analytic Listening

- Listening to the unconscious level of verbal and nonverbal communications
- Understanding symbolic communication, dreams, slips of the tongue, etc

Countertransference

- Recognizing countertransference and using induced feelings
- Distinguishing between subjective and objective countertransference
- Resolving countertransference resistances
