Clinical Experience

CP 330 Practicum of 100 hours, 40 of which are direct client contact hours The requirement for the practicum is met in the first semester (practicum semester) of the Fieldwork Placement.

Supervision: Total 25 hours

10 hours individual supervision

5 hours group supervision (CP111 meets this requirement)

10 additional hours of either individual or group supervision (7 hrs met by CP 111)

Individual supervision takes place at the site, 10 hours are required altogether (approximately every other week) with a licensed mental health professional. Twelve hours of individual psychoanalytic supervision are required through the school. (CP331) Twelve hours of group supervision are required at the school. (CP111). An additional 3 hours of either individual or group are required and usually fulfilled at the site. All CP111 supervisors are qualified supervisors.

CP 350 Internship of 600 hours, 240 of which are direct client contact hours

The requirement for the internship is met in the second two semesters (internship semesters) of the Fieldwork Placement. Counseling students must attend 15 hours/week and see at least 6-7 client hours/week over the course of a full year.

Supervision: Total 45 hours

15 hours individual supervision (on site)

15 hours group supervision (CP111 meets this requirement)

15 hours either individual or group supervision (7 hrs met by CP111)

Individual supervision takes place at the site and must be with a licensed mental health professional, usually on an every other week basis, totally approximately 24 hours. Twenty four to twenty five hours of group supervision are required at the school. 24 hours of individual (CP351) supervision are also required through the school.

Note: To meet psychoanalytic training program requirements, students see minimally four psychotic patients for three semesters to have the experience of working over time with regressed individuals. This may be part of the internship experience or additional placement hours in another setting. Work this out with the Fieldwork Coordinator, Ms. Woolbert.
